

N all New England there cannot be found a more delightful sheet of water or finer lake region than Sunapee. Beautifully situated at the base of Old Sunapee Mountain. 1500 feet above sea level, surrounded by the granite hills of Merrimack and Sullivan Counties, with its mirrory surface, many islands, sandy beaches, rough rocky shores, large groves, windy points and pleasant harbors, makes a variety of lake scenery seldom if ever equalled.

A dozen years ago and Sunapee was comparatively unknown to the outside world. A steamboat's
whistle had never been heard, and not a summer
hotel or cottage, or hardly a score of row boats could
be found on all its borders; but it was not long to
remain thus. One or two cottages were built, then a
hotel and a small steamer. Soon more, until to-day
six steamboats and hundreds of sail and row boats
ply its waters, furnishing every facility for the

tourists visiting the place.

Located thirty miles north-west of Concord, it is reached from Boston by a four hours' ride from Boston & Lowell Depot to Lowell, through the Valley of the Merrimac to Nashua, Manchester and Concord, the State Capital; then over the Claremont Road to Newbury where three steamboats connect for all

parts of the Lake.

The * Porest * House

S situated in a large grove at BLODGETT'S LANDING on the East Shore of the Lake, four miles from Newbury Depot. with steamboat connection to all trains. For the beauty of its location and surroundings and healthfulness of its climate it is unsurpassed. Many contemplated improvements have been made about the house and grove since the close of last season. Swings, hammocks and rustic seats are

scattered about the grounds and every effort will be made for the comfort and happiness of its guests. In all departments the most efficient help have been secured.

The Dining Room is large, airy and well lighted and will seat 200 persons. The table will be supplied with the best of everything that the large farm connected can produce, or money procure. First-class Livery Stable near the house. Bowling Alley and Photograph Rooms on the grounds. A new Barber Shop, opposite the Hotel, will be under the management of Mr. Geo. W. Morrell, of Gloucester, Mass. A Store and Ice Cream Room will be run in connection with the House; a full line of groceries, provisions, fishing tackle and campers' supplies always on hand. Tents, Sail and new Row Boats to let. A number of pleasant Cottages, furnished or unfurnished, to let by the day, week or for the season.

Fishing parties will find this the most central headquarters about the Lake, which is well stocked with trout, salmon and bass. Fishing tackle for sale and plenty of live bait to be had of Mr. Woodard, near the House.

Post Office at the Hotel, two mails daily: telegrams and express matter promptly attended to. Steamers to and from Newbury Station and all parts of the Lake, three times a day. Trains leave Boston at 8.30 a. m. and 1 p. m., arrive at Newbury at 12.30 and 5 p. m. Leave Newbury for Boston at 8.37 a. m. and 5 p. m.

No pains will be spared to make our patrons comfortable and their stay pleasant and agreeable.
