Meeting opened at 3:10 P.M. in President Doubleday presiding.

Secretary's report read and approved.

Treasurer's report read. Annual report folders distributed and corrections explained by the Treasurer. Report was accepted.

Treasurer's report on receipts and disbursements from Jan. 1-1923 to Aug. 1, 1920 read and approved.

Discussion in regard to Mr. Bowles note. Motion made and seconded that Secretary write Mr. Bowles to ask the amount of the note as it now stands. In regard to piping water to Dennis Court

to ask Mr. Bowles if he has made any plans for so doing and if not to ask permission to lay pipe across his property. Also to ask Mr. Bowles if the C. O. A. is not entitled to a deed to the Tennis Court property, and if so, to submit one. A copy of the Treasurer's report and Mr. Cressy's bill for wiring of Tennis Court to be sent to Mr. Bowles also.

No report made in regard to Ralph Piper being interviewed to take care of the tennis courts. Motion made and seconded that a responsible person be appointed to take charge of all the games including tennis giving that person 50% of the gross earnings of same. The charge for games to be determined by the Trustees.

Motion made and seconded that Mr. Taylor and Dr. Doubleday look over the matter of piping water to the Tennis Court from the brook. Mr. Taylor donated about 200 ft. of pipe and Mr. Cressy about the same amount. No further discussion.

Motion made and seconded that resolution in regard to Junior League and submitted by Mr. Cressy be accepted motion.

was made and seconded that copy of resolution be sent to Junior League to be voted upon.

Motion made and seconded that "Public Park" sign be put up in the Park.

Motion made and seconded that a tote of thanks be extended to Mrs. Francis Boly for donating her music to better our motion picture entertainments.

A report made by Mrs. Cressy on the coming Annual Rotary Club at Bladgett's Landing. The date to be changed from Aug 8th to some later day out of respect to our late President Warren S. Harding. The day to be an outing day. Committees appointed by Mrs Cressy to take charge of the games, the beach, the parking of cars and the Casino. Free use of the grounds to be given but charge made for the use of all games just the same as for pool and bowling.

No report from Mrs. Howard in regard to rebuilding of the board walk. No further discussion.

Mrs. Howard donated hose necessary for the
tennis court.

Motion made and seconded that Ralph Piper
be given full charge of Tennis Court; that 25¢ per
hour be charged each person on 50¢. for the morning
and 50¢ for the afternoon for the use of the court.

Motion made and seconded that Mrs. Taylor
be given charge of the board walk; to care for it this
fall and to do the work necessary next spring; to
be completed not later than June 15, 1924. Mrs. Taylor
authorized by vote to spend \$100. If more money
necessary to get into communication with the
president.

Mrs. Cressy reported that the Club House

was now in a safe condition and submitted
a bill for \$6.00.

Motion of engaging Mr. Clay and Mr.
Scotti for next year deferred to the President.

Motion made and seconded that set
of keys to the Safety Deposit vault held
by Mrs Edgar Smith, be returned to the
Treasurer.

Discussion of Mr. Bowles note deferred
to Special Meeting of Trustees to be held
at the Casino Aug. 18, 1923 at 7:30 P.M.

Dear Madam:

In reply to yours of August 6th regarding Cottage Owners Association.

I find that on May 20th, 1923 I gave them a check for \$450.00 as a loan, but have never received a note.

Regarding water for tennis courts. I doubt very much whether the spring that supplies Mr. Hall's house will be sufficient to supply water for the courts, and I do not see how he can find out until probably next year. If in the meantime the association wishes to run a pipe from the brook on my land, they have my permission.

There was an agreement drawn up by Mr. Donegan between the Cottage Owners and myself for a lease of the land on which the tennis courts are. I am unable to find this agreement, and do not remember whether it was ever signed or not. I shall be glad, however, to get together with the association and fix this matter up as soon as possible. A deed for this land was never contemplated.

I am returning the bills that you sent me as I feel that I have already paid more than my share towards these courts, and I do not personally feel like going to any further expense in regard to the courts.

In case the \$450.00 is paid some time this season there will be no interest charged.

Meeting opened at 3:15 P.M.

Secretary's report read and approved.

In regard to the sanitary work, President Cressy reported that Mr. Scotti had tendered his resignation; that Mr. Mason had accepted the contract for it in accordance with his letter, read at the previous Trustee meeting; that \$5 extra had been paid Mr. Mason for cleaning up work left by Mr. Scotti, and that the question of taking care of the earth closets would be taken care of by the president.

Treasurer's report read and approved showing balance on hand to date of \$357.21.

Suggestion made in regard to changing the policy of the Club House Insurance - the policy with Sunapee Mutual Fire Insurance Company. No definite action taken.

Report made that 4 keys to the padlock
on the Club House had been purchased. One
was for Mr. Sherman Clay, two for Mr. Cressy,
and one for Electric light man.

Question of the care of the Park and Tennis
grounds for next year discussed. No definite
action taken. Secretary to write colleges and
preparatory schools for applicants for the
position - the room rent to be free - and to
report at next meeting.

Suggestion made by Mr. Cressy to
raffle off a radio outfit for the purpose of
raising money - The chances to be sold
during the winter.

Suggestion made by Dr. Doubleday that
a bathing shoot would be an added attraction
to the beach and that a charge be made for

wearing bathing suits. No action taken.

Discussion in regard to fixing the landing attached to Casino. Motion made and seconded that Mr. Simonds be appointed to look over this and that he be given the work if his figure for repair is reasonable.
