COTTAGE OWNERS' ASSOCIATION BLODGETT LANDING, N. H. CONSTITUTION ARTICLE I NAME The Cottage Owners' Association of Blodgett Landing ARTICLE II Membership

A - Active Members

The active members of this Association shall consist of cottage owners at Blodgett Landing in good standing who have paid their annual dues.

B - Associate Members

Summer residents and guests at Blodgett Landing who are not property owners may become associate members.

C - Contributing Members

Those who desire to further the interests of the Cottage Owners' Association through paying annual dues of \$25.00.

D - Membership shall cease upon failure to pay the annual dues within thirty (30) days after date fixed by the trustees. This provision may be suspended in special cases by a majority vote of the trustees. Upon the death of any member all rights of such member in the corporation or its assets shall forthwith terminate.

ARTICLE III

- Voting
- A An active member is entitled to two votes at the reguiar or special meetings of the Association.
- B An Associate Member is entitled to one vote.
- 0 A contributing member shall have the same voting Power as an active member.

ARTICLE IV

The annual dues of active members shall be \$10.00 per cottage owned at Blodgett Landing, payable on or before July 15 of each year or such later date as may be fixed by the trustees.

The annual dues of associate members shall be \$5.00 payable on or before July 15.

ARTICLE V

A - The annual meetings shall be held on the first Saturday in August.

B - Special meetings may be called by the President or three members of the Board of Trustees, as needed to transact the affairs of the Association.

Notices of annual meetings shall be sent to all members in good standing not later than ten (10) days preceding such meeting.

Notices of special meetings shall be sent to all members in good standing not later than three (3) days preceding the meet-

Hotices of regular and special meetings shall be posted in

sortices of regular and special meetings shall be posted in conspicuous places at the Casino and Post Office at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the meeting.

ARTICLE VI

Quorum

Six (6) members shall constitute a quorum at a regular or special meeting.

ARTICLE VII

Amendment

Amendment to the constitution or by-laws may be made at the annual meeting or at special meetings by majority vote of the members present provided a notice of the proposed amendment has been sent to all members in good standing thirty (30) days in advence of the date acted upon.

ARTICLE VIII

Board of Trustees

A Board of Trustees composed of eleven (11) members of the Association shall be elected at the annual meeting in 1931; six (6) for a term of two (2) years, and five (5) for one (1) year. At the annual meetings therefore five (5) members shall be elected for a term of two years on the even year, and six (6) members for a term of two years on the odd year.

ARTICLE IX

Organization of Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees shall meet within thirty-six (36) hours following the annual meeting for the purpose of electing from their numberthe following officers:

President Vice-President Treasurer Asst. Treasurer Recording Secretary

Corresponding Secretary Auditor

Former officers shall hold office until the new officers are elected.

The Board of Trustees shall have the power to fill vacancies occurring among its officers or members for unexpired terms.

Three (3) members shall constitute a quorum for trustees.

BY LAWS

ARTICLE I

Duties of Officers and Trustees

- A The various officers shall function as is the common custom of the office hold.
- B The President and the Board of Trustees shall have the power to appoint committees or commissions.
- C A Nominating Committee shall be appointed by the President at least ton (10) days prior to the annual meeting.
- D The President shall employ the custodian of the Casine, the sanitation man and such other help as may be necessary for the conduct of the activities of the Cottage Owners' Association, subject to the approval of the Trustees.

The annual dues of associate members shall be 3.00 payable


